If applicable, evidence of ethics approval must be supplied before any funds (if awarded) will be released. The closing date for applications is January 31st and August 1st each year. Applicants will be kept informed of the progress of their application but should be aware that a decision can take up to four months. Applications which do not comply with the stated word limits will be rejected
